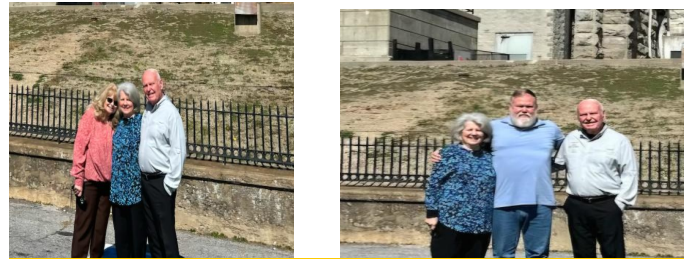

On January 1st, 2025, several female inmates were baptized at the Logan County Detention Center.

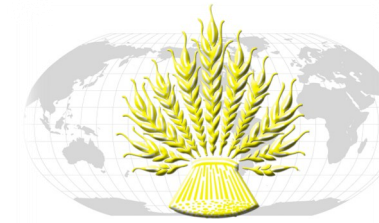

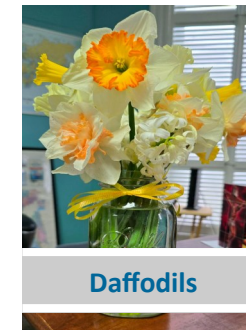

Paule and the 13 orphans have been relocated to the northern area of Haiti. The gang activity and danger in Petionville made it necessary to move up north, so the children would be safe. The lease on this house is \$9,000 for 1 year. Agape has paid \$4,500 and we are in need of \$4,500 to complete our 1 year lease. The house has a nice kitchen, living room, 3 bedrooms and 3 bathrooms, plus a nice yard with a fence so the children can play outside.

10 of the children are now attending public school in North Haiti. 3 are too young to attend school.

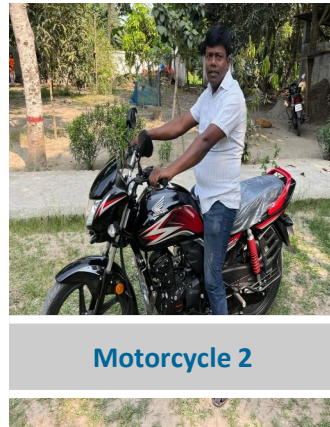


AGAPE SERVICE BANGLADESH TRUST

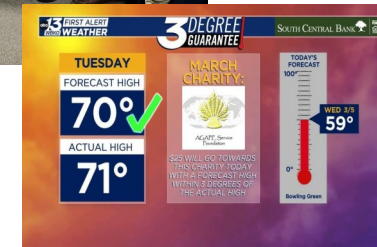
